2. Master's Thesis Proposal

Your Master's Thesis combines the academic rigor of an in-depth research effort with the practical experience of developing a manuscript for potential publication. Students apply knowledge and skills they've acquired in the classroom to address contemporary theoretical frameworks and related challenges confronting museums through well-formulated research, analysis, and the presentation of their final capstone product. Your final product (in Plan I – Thesis track) should be guided by your graduate committee of three approved committee members who have expertise in the subject and experience in research; to that end, your committee should be constituted by the start of the semester in which your research begins. Your committee chairperson is asked to sign this form in recognition and support of your thesis proposal.

Attach to this form a written proposal (approximately 3 to 5 double-spaced pages) for your graduate thesis with brief supporting bibliography.

The proposal should include the following:

- Your overarching thesis or proposed research question and brief summary, including the goals and objectives for this capstone product. Why is this an interesting and valuable effort to undertake?
- Describe your specific contribution to the question (i.e., the research you will pursue, how you will analyze and present the results). If this research is part of a larger collaborative effort, such as a museum exhibit or publication project, please describe how your work connects project-tasks being carried out by other project members and museum staff.
- Note who you will be working with both at your research institution and the faculty members you have invited to serve as your faculty review committee.
- Ideal timeline for the thesis: note what you believe will be your proposed schedule and timeline to completion. Are there firm deadlines that your committee should be aware of (for example, an exhibit opening or other constraint on your host institution)?
- Deliverables: In addition to a thesis manuscript that critically addresses relevant topics in museum studies, please provide a preliminary list of additional anticipated deliverables for the project (e.g., exhibit related materials, object research, reports, etc.).
